CONFERENCES

Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association

From the very beginning in 1888, the MIAA, America's oldest collegiate athletic conference, has conducted full-season championships in multiple sports, and developed into one of the nation's finest NCAA Division III conferences. Since 1990, MIAA member colleges have won 23 national Division III championships, offering 22 sports for men and women. Of the 13 schools that have had full membership in the conference, nine are still members — Adrian, Albion, Alma, Calvin, Hope, Kalamazoo, Olivet, Saint Mary's and Trine.

Indiana Collegiate Hockey Conference

Trine's ACHA Division 3 team competes in the ICHC, which began play in the 2014-15 season and now includes ACHA Division 3 teams from Ball State, Butler, Indiana University, Purdue, Purdue-Fort Wayne and Miami (Ohio) as well as Trine.

Midwest Collegiate Volleyball League

The MCVL was formed in the summer of 2014 and is the eighth NCAA men's volleyball conference in NCAA Division III.

Northern Collegiate Hockey Association

The conference for Trine's NCAA Division III men's and women's teams, the original NCHA was founded in 1980 with six men's hockey teams from Minnesota and Wisconsin. In 2000, athletic directors from five schools formed the women's hockey conference of the same name, using the men's conference as a model. The current men's conference is also a product of the "Midwest Collegiate Hockey Association," which was formed in 1998. In 2013, the MCHA merged with the men's and women's NCHA conferences, resulting in the current association.

Great Midwest Hockey League

Trine University's ACHA Division 2 men's hockey team competes in the Great Midwest Hockey League (GMHL). The GMHL is made up of teams from the Great Lakes region, and is one of the top ACHA Division 2 leagues in the country. Besides Trine, conference members include Ferris State University, Grand Valley State University, the University of Michigan, Michigan State University, Indiana University and Davenport University.

Great Lakes Esports Conference

Trine University is a founding member of the Great Lakes Esports Conference, which has provided enhanced competition opportunities for top esports programs throughout the Great Lakes region since 2019.

Thunder Ice Arena

The home of Trine University's men's and women's hockey, figure and synchronized skating, the Thunder Ice Arena, opened in 2017, features an NCAA-compliant ice rink, carpeted varsity locker rooms with flat-screen TVs for replays from the prior period of play, and a laser light system for player introductions.



ATHLETIC FACILITIES

Jannen Field

Home to Trine University baseball, Jannen Field was upgraded in 2010 with a new press box and backstop featuring a three-foot-high brick wall.



Zollner Stadium

Home of Trine University's championship football team as well as men's and women's lacrosse, Zollner Stadium, opened in 2010, is the focal point of the university's annual Homecoming activities, seating more than 5,000 fans for day and night games. A new digital scoreboard was added in 2020.



Ryan Tennis Center

Dedicated in 2015, Ryan Tennis Center features six courts with a seating and plaza area for tournament officiating for Trine University men's and women's tennis.



Hershey Hall

Host of many championship athletic events, historic 4,500-seat Hershey Hall is dedicated to NCAA Division III volleyball, Thunder wrestling and student intramural sports.



Weaver Field

Dedicated in 2013, Weaver Field is home to Trine University's men's and women's soccer teams.



Keith E. Busse/Steel Dynamics Inc. Athletic and Recreation Center

With a 200-meter track, the Keith E. Busse/Steel Dynamics Inc. Athletic and Recreation Center (known as the ARC) hosts indoor track and field meets. Opened in 2009, the building also hosts practices for baseball, softball, tennis, lacrosse, cross country and track.



MTI Center (above)

Opened in 2018, the 3,500-seat MTI Center serves as the home for Trine University men's and women's basketball, esports and bowling. Providing a state-of-the-art venue for Thunder sports and fans, the MTI Center includes a 4K digital scoreboard, six-lane bowling alley, esports arena, fitness center with area for free weights and machines, and the pro shop and banquet room for Zollner Golf Course.



Zollner Golf Course

An 18-hole championship golf course, Zollner Golf Course is appreciated for its beautifully landscaped, undulating fairways, scenic views and hilly terrain. Established in 1971 as a gift from Trine's Board of Trustees, Zollner has hosted the NCAA Division III Women's Golf National Championship and has been the site of NAIA golf championships, Indiana PGA Assistant Championships, Indiana PGA Junior Championships and Indiana Open qualifiers. Zollner Golf Course was recently ranked the sixth best collegiate golf course in the nation by members of GolfAdvisor.



SportONE/Parkview Softball Field

The SportONE/Parkview Softball Field has been the site of continued success for the Trine University softball team, which has made two appearances in the NCAA Division III Softball Championship, was third in the nation in 2019, has won three regional titles in the last six years and made 12 consecutive postseason appearances. A new field surface, dugouts, batting cages, expanded seating and press box were added in 2015.
